



David McConney

A banker with over 23 years experience, McConney began his career in Toronto, Canada in 1979 with Bank of Montreal. In 1989 he returned to Barbados with CIBC, to establish that bank's first Commercial Banking Centre there. Since that time he has held several positions with CIBC in Barbados, the Bahamas and the Cayman Islands. He was the Managing Director of CIBC Caribbean Limited for three years until June 1999. In that position he had responsibility for the bank's operations in Barbados, Antigua, St. Lucia and St. Vincent. He was also a member of the Executive Management Committee for CIBC West Indies Holdings Limited, a director of Caricard Services Limited and Vice Chairman of Caribbean Integrated Financial Services Limited. He assumed the position of President and CEO of Cayman National Bank in July 1999. He left that bank at the end of August 2003 to take up the position of President and CEO of V2R Financial Services. During his banking career he implemented two major core-banking systems, one with CIBC and the other with Cayman National Bank. He has also launched Internet and Telephone Banking systems, a new multicurrency debit card program and several other major banking technology initiatives. He served as Chairman of the Phoenix Banking System International Users Group for over 2 years and continues to serve as a Director of that group. Originally from Barbados, he received his education in Ireland and the United States. He holds a degree in Economics and Political Science and has also obtained his banking qualifications through the Institute of Canadian Bankers. McConney is a Paul Harris Fellow with Rotary International. He was a recipient of the Chairman's Award from CIBC and has served on the boards of several civic organizations. He is currently a member of the judging panel for the University of Western Ontario's Richard Ivey Business School International Business Case Competition
